

FESTIVAL FAVORITE BRULÉ RETURNS TO LANDMARK PLAZA STAGE

(OMAHA, Neb.) May 31, 2017 – Award-winning contemporary Native American group Brulé will be the exclusive performer on the Landmark Plaza Stage at the 43rd annual Omaha Summer Arts Festival (OSAF).

OSAF is presented by First National Bank and takes place in downtown Omaha June 9-11 on Farnam Street alongside the Gene Leahy Mall. Hours are 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Friday, June 9, and Saturday, June 10; and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, June 11.

The Landmark Plaza Stage is located on the south side of Farnam Street (between 11th and 13th Streets). Brulé is planning to play several sets from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday and from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on both Saturday and Sunday.

Through the years, Brulé—founded by Paul LaRoche—has pushed the boundaries of contemporary Native American rhythms and classic rock in their genre-blending selections. The five-piece rock ensemble is augmented with an array of traditional Native American instrumentation and paired with one of the top Native American dance troupes, creating a one-of-a-kind, multi-dimensional art form and musical journey.
